

Jesus' Passion Week: An Easter Bible Study

Jesus' last week on earth before His crucifixion is called the Passion Week. *Passio* is a Latin rendering of the Greek word *pathos* meaning suffering, deep emotion, and longing. Both love and agony accompanied Jesus through each day of Passion Week. Use this Bible study through Jesus' Passion Week for both your personal spiritual growth and with those you're discipling.
